NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE CITY OF ALEDO, TEXAS, CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION

TAKE NOTICE the City Council of the City of Aledo, Texas, shall convene at 6:00 o'clock P.M. on the 24th day of August, 2023, at the Aledo Community Center, 104 Robinson Court, Aledo, Texas, and, during such meeting, the City Council will consider the passage of an ordinance authorizing the issuance of certificates of obligation in a principal amount not to exceed \$2,000,000 for the purpose of paying contractual obligations to be incurred for (i) designing, constructing, acquiring, improving and equipping a city hall housing public safety facilities, municipal court facilities, library facilities, administrative offices for the city's street and water and sewer utility departments, city council chambers and facilities for various other governmental functions of the City (and any necessary or related removal of existing facilities) and (ii) professional services rendered in connection with such projects and the financing thereof, and such certificates shall be payable from ad valorem taxes and a limited pledge of the net revenues of the City's combined Waterworks and Sewer System. In accordance with Texas Local Government Code Section 271.049, (i) the current principal amount of all of the City's outstanding public securities secured by and payable from ad valorem taxes is \$18,515,000; (ii) the current combined principal and interest required to pay all of the City's outstanding public securities secured by and payable from ad valorem taxes on time and in full is \$37,856,956.31; (iii) the estimated combined principal and interest required to pay the certificates of obligation to be authorized on time and in full is \$4,498,375.00; (iv) the maximum interest rate for the certificates may not exceed the maximum legal interest rate; and (v) the maximum maturity date of the certificates to be authorized is August 15, 2057. The above information excludes \$14,025,000 in principal amount of outstanding debt obligations the City has designated as self supporting which the City reasonably expects to pay from revenue sources other than ad valorem taxes; provided, however, that in the event such self-supporting revenue sources are insufficient to pay debt service, the City is obligated to levy ad valorem taxes to pay such debt obligations.
